Thanks to the support of our incredible donors, 2017 was a year of success and progress for the IECA Foundation. We granted \$51,500 to 31 organizations across 19 states. We held our biggest fundraiser yet in Washington, DC, hosting more than 300 guests and raising over \$45,000 towards our mission. We also began a partnership with a national nonprofit consulting firm to identify organizational efficiencies and further professionalize our operations so that we can better fulfill the Foundation's mission.

While 2017 was indeed a year to remember and celebrate, we are moving into the new year with excitement. In 2018, we plan to grant at least \$75,000 to organizations that address the needs of underserved students. We strive to expand our reach, touching the lives of more students each year.
